

Polyester, acrylic and acetate fabrics **cannot** be dyed with **Dylon Multi Purpose Dye**.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR HAND DYEING

Wear rubber gloves.

- 1. Weigh the dry textiles. Wash the dry textiles (without softener). The textiles to be dyed have to be completely wet.
- 2. Fill a rustproof container with hot water so that the textile to be dyed is completely covered with water and can easily be moved.
- 3. Dissolve the dye in 500ml of boiling water and pour the solution in the dye container.
- 4. Add 60g of salt per 500g of fabric and mix well.
- 5. Now put the wet and unfolded textile in the dye solution. Immerse it completely in the solution and heat the dye solution at 80°C respectively 95°C depending on the type of fabric. Now dye the fabric for 20 minutes, stirring it continuously and keeping the temperature constant.
- 6. Rinse the textile until the water is clear.
- 7. For drying, avoid sunlight and direct heat (do not tumble dry).
- 8. Wash dyed textiles separately.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR WOOL & SILK

Avoid temperature changes!

Wear rubber gloves. Replace salt with 250g of vinegar!

- 1. 4. see HAND DYEING
- 5. Put the wet, unfolded textile in the dye solution. Stir gently while bringing to the boil, then reduce the heat.
- 6. Stir gently for another 10 minutes.
- 7. Take the textile carefully out of the dye bath, allow to cool completely and rinse with luke warm water until the water is clear
- 8. Avoid sun and direct heat when drying (do not tumble dry).
- 9. Wash dyed textiles separately.

BUTTONS & PLASTIC OBJECTS

For all plastic materials including polyester. Wear rubber gloves.

- 1. Dissolve 5g of dye in 500ml of boiling water.
- 2. Put plastic objects in the dye bath, maximally 125g. CAUTION: all objects have to be covered completely by the dye
- Bring the dye bath to the boil and dye objects for 10 minutes.
- 4. Rinsing: same as for textiles.
- 5. During the dye process the objects to dye should be checked regularly to avoid irregularities.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE WASHING MACHINE

- · Not for wool and silk.
- Dye at least 500g of fabric. Load washing machine maximally up to the half. Do not select eco program.

Instructions for use:

Wear rubber gloves.

- 1. Weigh the dry textiles. Wash the dry textiles (without softener). The textiles to be dyed must be completely wet.
- 2. Select the longest and warmest washing program without pre-wash (at least 80°C)
- 3. Add 500g of salt per wash load and fill it directly in the drum or dissolve it first and pour the solution in the washing powder compartment.
- 4. Dissolve the dye in approx. 1 liter of boiling water and carefully pour it into the washing powder compartment after 5 minutes.
- 5. For drying avoid sunlight and direct heat (do not tumble dry).
- 6. Cleaning of the washing machine: either wash once dark clothes or make an empty wash at 95°C.
- 7. Wash dyed textiles separately.

For 500g of fabric you need these dye quantities:

16g - Ebony Black

12g - Havanna Brown, Coffee, Navy

10g - Old Gold, Golden Glow, Pagoda Red, Bordeaux, Rose of Paris, Windsor Purple, Madonna Blue, Deep Blue, Elephant Grey, Reindeer Beige, Emerald, Jungle Green, Tangerine, Scarlet, Kingfisher, Desert Dust, Cerise, Olive Green
